SINCE THE VERY BEGINNING EMERGENCY PROVIDES BASIC HEALTH TREATMENT FOR PRISONERS AND ORPHANS



PROJECT DEVELOPMENT

- PANJSHER VALLEY BECAME THE MOST PEACEFUL AREA IN AFGHANISTAN
- 2003 EMERGENCY OPENS A MATERNITY CENTRE
- IN ANABAH VILLAGE, EMERGENCY PROVIDES ELECTIVE AND EMERGENCY SURGERY, PEDIATRIC AND ADULT INTERNAL MEDICINE.
- 2014 NEW MATERNITY DEPARTMENT



PROJECT DEVELOPMENT

- KABUL HOSPITAL BECAME A TRAUMA CENTRE FOR WAR AND CIVILIAN TRAUMA.
- 2003 OPENING OF ICU DEPARTMENT WITH 6 BEDS VENTILATED.
- 2005 A CT-SCAN HAS BEEN INSTALLED.



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PROJECT DEVELOPMENT

- SINCE JULY 2010, BECAUSE OF THE INCREASED OF INJURED PATIENT, THE ADMISSION CRITERIA HAVE BEEN RESTRICTED BACK TO WAR VICTIMS ONLY
- 2014 EXPANTION OF KABUL HOSPITAL CREATING A NEW OT/ICU/SICU DEPARTMENTS (UPGRADE TO 124 BED CAPACITY)



PROJECT DEVELOPMENT

- LASHKARGAH IS THE ONLY SPECIALIZED TRAUMA HOSPITAL IN THE HELMAND PROVINCE.
- SINCE THE BEGINNING, OPEN CRITERIA FOR CIVIL TRAUMA FOR CHILDREN BELOW 14 YEARS OLD.



PROJECT DEVELOPMENT

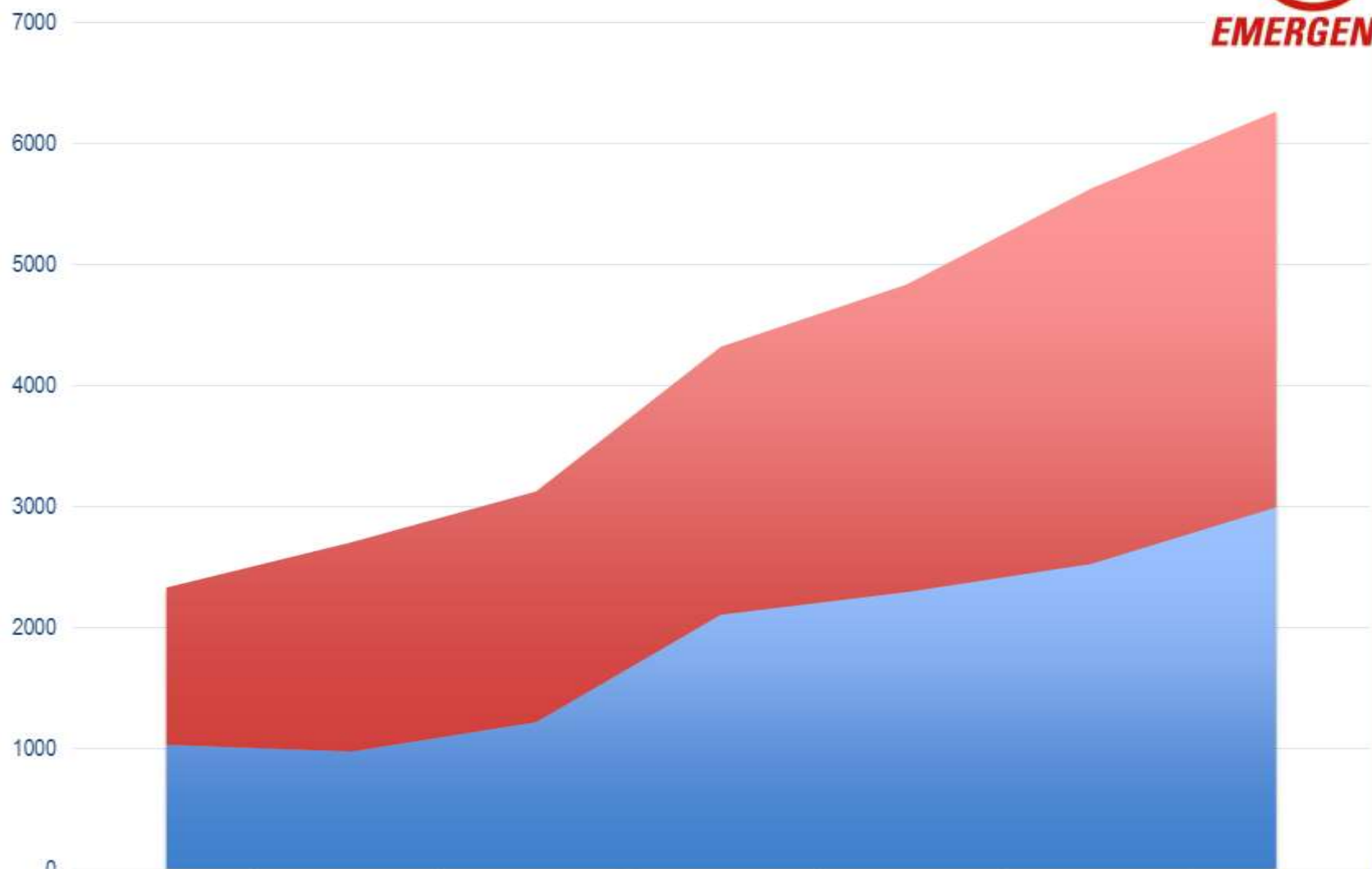
- SINCE 2013, BECAUSE OF INCREASING OF WAR VICTIMS, NO CHANCE TO TREAT CIVIL TRAUMA ANYMORE.
- 2014 OPENING OF A NEW SURGICAL WARD (BED CAPACITY UP TO 90 BEDS)

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FIELD ACTIVITIES

FAPs PROVIDE PROMPT TREATMENT ALSO TO THE POPULATION OF THE MOST REMOTE AREAS OR EFFECTED BY THE CONFLICT

THESE CLINICS CREATE A SATELLITE NETWORK SURROUNDING THE MAIN HOSPITAL



PROMPT TREATMENT AND REFERRAL WITH AMBULANCE AND NURSE ON BOARD



FIELD ACTIVITIES

- EMERGENCY WORKS IN 10 AFGHAN PROVINCES
- 44 CLINICS PRESENT IN THE COUNTRY
- NO FARER THAN 4 HOURS FROM THE HOSPITAL
- CONTINUOUS EVALUATION AND POSSIBLE EXPANTION

- TRAINING FOR STAFF WORKING FOR MOPH
- BASIC TRAUMA COURSE FOR SURGEONS
- TRIAGE AND MASS CASUALTY MANAGEMENT FOR NURSES WORKING IN PROVINCIAL HOSPITALS



- PRE HOSPITAL TRAUMA CARE FOR DOCTOR AND NURSES WORKING IN REMOTE AND CONFLICT AFFECTED AREA

SECURITY

- EMERGENCY REPUTATION
- NEUTRAL AND EXPERIENCED SERVICE PROVIDED.
- RESPECT OF LOCAL CULTURE
